

## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

With many people travelling over the summer, I have tried to get the word "out" in as many forms as possible. But if you have not heard already, I have prayerfully decided to return the call to Messiah Lutheran Church in Holt, Michigan. While Messiah shared many opportunities for outreach, and the people at the church were incredibly welcoming, I have decided that there's still much to be done here at St Paul.

I wanted to thank those of you that shared your thoughts and concerns. I had an opportunity to have some open and honest talks with a few of you – beyond the "please don't go" – and you brought some clarity to my deliberation. We were able to talk about St Paul's past, and her future, and do so in a very constructive way.

However, the reason I'm writing this article is that I wanted to share with everyone one of the most important conversations I had during this process. It wasn't from a family member or a member of St Paul, it was with a member of the community. This person shared that they know I have to consider my family, and I have to consider the church, but they said that if they could speak on behalf of the community of Skokie, "Please don't go." They shared that the community needs St Paul and the energy we bring.

Dear friends in Christ, this is amazing. A long time ago, when we were working through reFocus, we had groups draw pictures of what our missional impact could be on the community of Skokie. Every picture somehow had St Paul involved in the center of the community. We knew that it would take some time to change Skokie's picture of St Paul and assumptions of who we are – but that did not stop us from trying to be a blessing to those around us.

Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

Brothers and sisters, the change we set out to do – we're doing it! The community has taken note of St Paul and knows that we try to be a blessing to those around us. St Paul has been working hard to be that shining light in the community, so that others might be blessed. All of the good that we do, or allowing the community to use our facilities, or giving coats to those who need it the most – we do this to bring glory to God. As we work to be a blessing to those around us, our hope and prayer is that others might give praise to our Father in heaven because of us. I returned the call to Holt, Michigan because there's still much work for us to do. The Lord's not finished with St Paul yet. It's not work that I can do alone, it's not the job of a single committee or just a handful of people – it's the job of us all. Every member of St Paul Lutheran Church can be, *must be*, involved in the work of the Church in some way or another. (And one of the easiest ways to do that is to pray for your church and her pastor – EVERYBODY can do that).

When I first made the announcement that I was staying, I again challenged everyone to think what St Paul might be doing should every member give 1 hour of time above and beyond attending services on Sunday. Let me repeat that for you – what would our church look like if everyone gave a single hour of their time? What impact would St Paul be making? What would *you* be doing? Dear friends in Christ, I need you, St Paul needs you, the community *needs* you. People are depending on us – let's walk together, be a shining light in our communities, and do those good deeds God has already prepared for us to do.
